



Public Policy Priorities

The AHEPA Family's mission, which is based on its cultural heritage extending back to the ideals of ancient Greece, and on its deep involvement in present-day community service programs, guides the organization's public policy priorities.

International Relations/Foreign Policy

- > Strengthen U.S. relations with Greece trusted, reliable NATO ally a pillar of democracy and stability in West
 - o Greece: geostrategic importance to U.S. security. **NSA Souda Bay**, Crete, is an undervalued military asset.
 - Back continued U.S. engagement on Greece's economic and migratory crises.
 - o Protect Greece's sovereignty in the Aegean Sea. Turkey's airspace violations must stop.
 - Maintaining Greece in the United States' Visa Waiver Program is in the U.S.'s national security interest.
 - H.Res.804: Support a mutually-acceptable solution to the name recognition issue of FYROM for <u>all uses</u>.
- > Secure religious freedom and protection for the Ecumenical Patriarchate the world's oldest Christian Church
 - Support H.Res.732: Urge Turkey to respect the rights & religious freedoms of Ecumenical Patriarchate and all religious minorities. Reopen the Orthodox Seminary at Halki.
- ➤ End the near 44-year illegal occupation of the Republic of Cyprus—a member of the European Union
 - o Back a just, viable solution where <u>all</u> Cypriots can enjoy the same democratic values & human rights that we do.
 - o CBM: Call for the removal of 40,000+ illegal Turkish occupation troops from Cyprus.
 - U.S. policy affirms Cyprus's sovereign right to explore energy findings within its exclusive economic zone (EEZ).

Strengthen Investments that Strengthen Our Society & Security

We understand it is a challenging budgetary environment. However, we seek to ensure proper federal funding levels for the following **cost-effective**, **lifesaving**, or **job creating** programs that impact our community service programs and projects:

- ➤ HUD Section 202 Housing for Elderly Program: AHEPA/DOP combined have 95 properties (5,049 units) spanning 21 states.
 - FY19 HUD 202 Ask: \$619 million in renewal funding (includes \$120 million for service coordinators)
 - \$210M for Section 202 Capital Advance Program for new units. AHEPA/DOP waiting list: 5,111
 - Support S.548/H.R.1661: Strengthen the bipartisan-backed Affordable Housing Tax Credit.
- > NIH: Maximize investment in medical research. It improves Americans' lives and drives the economy. Of specific importance:
 - Thalassemia (Cooley's Anemia) research programs at NHLBI (Division of Blood Diseases Resources) & NIDDK (Kidney, Urologic, & Hematologic (KUH) Diseases Division); and cancer research at NCI.
- Domestic Violence Programs: FY19 Asks: Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) \$571 million; Victims of Crime Act (VOCA)
 Crime Victims Fund set cap at \$2.6 billion, without transfers to programs not authorized under VOCA.
 - Co-sponsor H.R.5363: Join bipartisan support to safeguard the Crime Victims' Fund.
- Foreign Aid: FY19 Ask: \$1.2M for Greece's International Military Education & Training Program.

Cultural

Co-sponsor H.Con.Res.51: Call for the restoration of the Parthenon--an important monument to our **American heritage** because the Parthenon is a hallmark of Western Civilization and Democracy--with the return of the Parthenon Marbles.

Veterans

Back S.238/H.R.751: Support a Presidential review of WWII hero Lt. Col. James Megellas' Medal of Honor case.
